

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR ATTACHMENT **OF MODEL 14 ADAPTER** FOR HARRIS BIPODS

MODEL 14 ADAPTER will only fit Ruger Mini-14® Standard and Ranch Rifles and the Mini-30®, will not fit Ruger folding stock. With the unloaded gun at hand, examine the adapter. The split flange on the body of the adapter fits between the sling bow and the gas block proper. After the set screw has been backed off flush to the bottom, hold the gun and adapter as shown in illustration. The locking tab may be dropped through the sling bow into notches provided in the flange. While taking up the set screw, make sure the locking tab fits into groove on top of the pinned finger (flange). Tighten the set screw as tight as possible with a large coin or a key. Do not use a screw driver. If the adapter is to be more or less a permanent fixture, a small amount of nutlock or the equivalent, may be applied to set screw threads. A sling may be attached in one of two ways, either to the adapter or by use of a Q.D. swivel using the bipod attachment device. If the adapter is removed, turn in set screw to mid position to prevent loss.

Mount the Harris Bipod Models L, LM, and BR with the legs folding forward. Tall Models 25C, 25 and H must be mounted with the legs to fold toward butt stock. No part of the Bipod with folded and fully retracted legs should extend beyond barrel muzzle.

In the interest of safety, do not reach across gun muzzle to unfold or adjust Bipod legs. For further tips on the use of the Harris Bipods see Bipod descriptive leaflet and Bipod instruction sheet available free from Harris Engineering, Inc.
